## DEAR FRIENDS OF THE BPO.

Thank you once again for helping to make the 2013-14 season one to remember. You – our subscribers, ticket buyers and donors – are our life-blood, and we could not exist without your support. That is why we are so excited to review with you some of the stellar moments of the past year. As we have mentioned in each of our recent "Reports to the Community," we are evaluating progress made each year in the light of three major strategic themes:

### GROW OUR AUDIENCE

- We achieved a record number of season ticket holders and subscription revenue for the third consecutive year.
- Our education program again reached 40,000 students in grades K-12; we increased efforts to sell affordable tickets to students and quadrupled participation in our Symphony Scholars program aimed at high school students.
- Summer programs played to over 35,000 people and new partnerships were formed. Perhaps most gratifying was the Doctors of the World concert, bringing 40 doctors from around the world to perform with the BPO in a performance that raised money for the new John R. Oishei Children's Hospital.

### DEVELOP AND GROW ARTISTICALLY

- We were privileged to perform two concerts at the prestigious Kravis Center for the Performing Arts in West Palm Beach, as part of a successful five-city Florida tour; the BPO was also honored to make its debut in Princeton, NI.
- Four recordings were released.

### Operate with Excellence and Fiscal Responsibility

- We achieved the ninth balanced budget out of the past ten seasons.
- Endowment funds rose with the market past the \$32 million mark. Another \$10 million has been pledged toward the goal of reaching the \$50 million mark within the decade.

We are well into the 2014-15 season and have already had some fantastic moments. We hope to see you at Kleinhans Music Hall often this year, or at any of the many venues we will perform in throughout Western New York.



### Gala Season Opener

Yo-Yo Ma returned to the Kleinhans stage for a sold-out performance of Osvaldo Golijov's mesmerizing work Azul; JoAnn Falletta, Michael Ludwig and Roman Mekinulov then joined him to perform a last-minute surprise encore to the enchantment of all.

The BPÓ, Shea's and Neglia Ballet Artists presented Tchaikovsky's *Nutcracker* for the fifth consecutive year to kick off the holidays. By the end of December more than 14,000 people attended seasonal concerts at Kleinhans Music Hall.



Superstar performers such as Bernadette Peters, Doc Severinsen and Chris Botti helped drive a 20% increase in single ticket buyers to the Pops Series while the number of subscribers jumped 13% over the previous season.







